Jesus Calls Us; o'er the Tumult; (ELW 696)

Dear Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

One only has to read or listen to the latest headlines in the news to know that our world is anything but quiet, peaceful, and orderly. There are wars raging. Politicians fight with no visible signs of progress. Weathers systems are getting more extreme. Families are not as stable as they used to be. Idols of all shapes and sizes call for our attention. In short, our world is in tumult. It is not all that hard to be lost amidst this unsettledness that surrounds us each day. And yet, together as the Body of Christ we are reminded that we still have hope in the midst of this world's tumult.

The hope that we share flows from the love of God and our calling into sharing the mission and ministry of Jesus. Often though, we need reminded of this fact. In these times of doubt, we can turn to our shared song, the hymns we sing during worship.

One particular hymn that has caught my attention this summer is Cecil Frances Alexander's *Jesus Calls Us;* o'er the *Tumult.* Before I get into the hymn, here is a little background from hymnary.org about the author.

As a small girl, Cecil Frances Humphries wrote poetry in her school's journal. In 1850 she married Rev. William Alexander, who later became the Anglican primate (chief bishop) of Ireland. She showed her concern for disadvantaged people by traveling many miles each day to visit the sick and the poor, providing food, warm clothes, and medical supplies. She and her sister also founded a school for the deaf. Alexander was strongly influenced by the Oxford Movement and by John Keble's Christian Year. She wrote hymns based on the Apostles' Creed, baptism, the Lord's Supper, the Ten Commandments, and prayer, writing in simple language for children. Her more than four hundred hymn texts were published in various hymnals.<sup>1</sup>

The verses of Alexander's *Jesus Calls Us; o'er the Tumult* remind us that even though the world around us tries to distract us and lead us astray, God is constantly calling us in to mission and ministry for the sake of the world. It is a beautiful reminder that we are secure in the arms of God's grace and love, even when we are being sent out into the world to serve all in the manner of Jesus. (The full text of the hymn follows the main body of this article.)

Our tumultuous world needs more than ever to hear the Gospel Good News. And that is where we, the current Body of Christ, come into the story of proclaiming God's words of hope and love for all of creation. We are called out into our world, rising above the tumult, to live out our faith in our communities and world. My hope and prayer for us is that we will always listen for the voice of Jesus calling us in to mission and ministry each day.


#### Pastor Announcement

As you know, since the beginning of the Covid pandemic, we have served 2 meals per month, the 2<sup>nd</sup> and last Tuesday each month. As things have progressed, the need for meals has increased from an annual average of 220 meals per setting to 275-285 in the last 3 meals.

Food prices are increasing, and our coffers are running low.

The Community Ministry Committee has decided to put a donation box out in the Zion sanctuary and the Good Hope Narthex. We would ask that you donate whatever change you may have to help with the cost of our meals and supplies. (Remember, we are in church and paper 'change' makes less noise (a). Everything donated will go directly to food and supplies for the dinners.

I would also remind any of you with Thrivent connections that we can use the Community Action Cards to help with the expenses of the meals with no out of pocket expense to you!!


- Assembling personal care kits for Lutheran World Relief
