

Words from Pastor Mike Parsh

Greetings sisters and brothers in Christ!

Waiting. It is not a skill that comes easy to most of us. The world around us says that we should not have to wait for anything. We have the option of same day delivery. Cell phones allow us to contact each other at any time. We want results now. And yet, we must often wait and try to be patient as humanity and the world moves at its own pace.

In the Church, we are beginning a season of the church year that is all about waiting. Advent is the time of waiting and preparing for the coming of our Lord and Savior Jesus Christ.

German theologian and pastor Dietrich Bonhoeffer, in a letter he wrote while he was imprisoned in the Tegel prison camp in nazi Germany, offers some insight about waiting during the season of Advent. Bonhoeffer writes:

Advent is a season of waiting, but our whole life is an Advent season, this is, a season of waiting for the last Advent, for the time when there will be a new heaven and a new earth.¹

Bonhoeffer is reminding his parents in this letter that as they prepare for the coming celebrations of Christ's birth, they are to also wait patiently for the last Advent when Christ will come again. Bonhoeffer is writing these words as he sits in prison at the whim of a crazed dictator and is seeing the world around him descend into chaos. Amid these terrible circumstances, Bonhoeffer writes words of peace and comfort that God will make everything new, and this world's pain and grief will be no more in the coming kingdom.

But this waiting that Bonhoeffer invites his family into, is not waiting without a call to action. He continues by writing the following:

Jesus stands at the door knocking (Rev. 3:20). In total reality, he comes in the form of a beggar, as the dissolute human child in ragged clothes, asking for help. He confronts you in every person that you meet. As long as there are people, Christ will walk the earth as your neighbor, as the one through whom God call you, speaks to you, makes demands on you. This is the great seriousness and great blessedness of the Advent message. Christ is standing at the door; he lives in the form of a human being among us.²

Bonhoeffer teaches us, that we have countless opportunities every day to encounter Christ in the people we interact with. We can, in our waiting for the last Advent, use these opportunities to proclaim God's love and grace to all. This may take on many different forms, but it is still God's gospel good news that is being proclaimed.

Sisters and brothers in Christ, in this season of waiting and preparing our hearts and minds for the coming celebrations of the birth of Christ I invite you to take time out of your full schedules to intentionally look for Christ in those that you interact with each day. You may just be surprised where you find Christ.







December 31 will be a combined congregation Lessons and Carols worship service at Zion Lutheran Church at 11:00am.


The Festival of Nine Lessons and Carols was first held on Christmas Eve, 1918, at King's college, Cambridge, England. Prominent organists and choral scholars made this style of liturgy quite popular in Europe. It was first broadcast in 1928 and, except for 1930, it has been broadcast annually, even during the Second World War. In recent decades, the tradition has spread around the world. The Cambridge style has remained for many years, even while local congregations adapt the service for their own use.

Wherever the service is heard and however it is adapted, whether the music is provided by choir or congregation, the pattern and strength of the service is derived from the lessons and not the music.

"The main theme is the development of the loving purposes of God... seen through the windows and words of the Bible." – Dean Milner-White, King's College.

We give thanks to Pastor Mark Fischer and the people of Twelve Apostles Lutheran Church, Saegertown, for sharing their adaptation of this service for the First Sunday of Christmas.

Just Cookies will host a coffee hour on December 10, 2023, after worship. Join us for fellowship and food!


Mitten Tree


