The Cross of Christ: Where God Meets Us

The death of Jesus Christ on the cross is central to the Christian's sacred story.

The miraculous story of creation, the ethical teachings of Jesus, the glory of the resurrected Christ, or the action of God in human history make no sense without this solemn sacrifice as its centerpiece.

Interpretations of the crucifixion of Jesus range from Jesus' blood washing away our sins, to Jesus--the fearless prophet who stood with humility and courage for truth against the powers of a great empire, to a cosmic battle between God and Satan for the souls of human beings.

Yet for each of us, there comes a time in our lives that no matter what the theological metaphor or the spiritual interpretation may be, the meaning of the cross must be, finally, a personal one. The cross outside Jerusalem was meant to have some connection with the cross in our own experience and the cross at the heart of life.

There are biblical narratives, church celebrations, and events in our own lives that play down the dark side of life and invite us to focus on strength, courage, beauty, and peace; and Lord knows, we need that.

During the Triduum, the great three days of Holy Week, we meditate on the complexity of evil in the world and the questions posed by life's pains and disappointments. For these are the conditions and questions that lead us to look for something or someone outside ourselves to make sense of our existence. On Good Friday, we look for a savior and find him dying on a cross and discover once again, it is here that God meets us.

Consider your own times of struggle – the problems, chronic conditions, and fears that you face. Consider the larger issues that affect our communities – poverty, addiction, lack of work or housing, a longing for meaning and purpose. Consider the world's pain – pandemics and disease, the inequities of health care, hunger in a world where there is enough food for all, civil unrest and justice denied, racism, hatred, and discrimination against those who have been cast off.



These are the sins – the brokenness -- for which Christ died. They remain our crosses to bear and to lift up in the wilderness. They are the places in our lives where God meets us as the dying and rising Christ.

Episcopal priest, Reid Isaac writes:

Meditating on the cross is meditating on the mystery by which good and evil are eternally mixed in the world. We are signed with the cross in our baptism and called to take up our cross daily and follow him. If we stay with the suffering of the innocent in this world, refusing to protect ourselves by denial or running away, when it comes our own time, we will discover we have a companion in our suffering. We have become brothers and sisters of the one whose cross was a victory, and out of whose death life came.¹

My friends in Christ, hear God's Word of promise for you in this holy season. May the Holy Spirit guide you daily to survey the wondrous cross and give you the strength and commitment to take it up and lift it high, 'til all the world knows the love of Jesus Christ.


Dear Good Hope family,

- Lutherlyn is encouraging and training leaders for the church.
 Over the past 75 years, many of the Lutherlyn summer staff have gone on to ordained ministry or serve in leadership roles in their congregations.

Stephen and Becky Thorson VisitApril 16 at worship

Steve and Becky Thorson will be joining Good Hope for a Sunday School presentation and a Temple Talk on Sunday, April 16, 2023.

Stephen and Becky Thorson have been missionaries sent by the World Mission Prayer League (a Lutheran mission) to the United Mission to Nepal in the country of Mt. Everest for 39 years. Becky is now very busy as the full-time Personnel Director at the WMPL Home Office in Minneapolis, MN. Stephen no longer works as a pediatrician after leaving Nepal. He continues to teach two courses of theology in Nepal every Fall (by Zoom for the two years due to COVID). In the Spring, he has taught theology at Bethany Global University (a mission school).


In 2021 and 2022, they were able to return to Nepal for 2-3 months and plan on doing so every year. Past Nepali language projects include Bibles for the Nepal Bible Society, an adapted Bible dictionary, SS materials, a Nepali Bible concordance, and Luther's Small Catechism. Steve wrote most of the topical articles for an original New Testament Commentary in Nepali. The later English version as The Applied New Testament Commentary and The Applied Old Testament Commentary have been translated into many languages. In December 2015, Stephen's book about C.S. Lewis, Joy and Poetic Imagination (Winged Lion), is now available in a Kindle version on Amazon. Becky, a licensed clinical counselor, taught English and social sciences to nursing students, taught at a Bible school, and ended up being the expatriate personnel director for UMN. Their son and daughter grew up in Nepal, and they have 3 grandchildren.

The Good Friday Laymen's Service






