


Stay and Play Update

Stay and Play is an after-school STREAM/STEAM/STEM program catering to at-risk youth in Oil City. We serve the children of our community every Monday, Wednesday and Friday from the hours of 3:00 pm until 8:00 pm and the third Saturday of each month from 11:00 am until 5:00 pm. Over the course of the past year, Stay and Play has seen remarkable growth and engagement, with new children attending our program almost daily! The program, designed to provide a supportive learning environment, has witnessed great success in its various activities and field trips. These included a fun-filled trip to the local bowling alley, a fun filled Christmas party and game of Christmas bingo with Pastor Parsh and Pastor Jones, energetic ga-ga ball matches at Good Hope Lutheran, an exciting overnight lock-in at the YMCA, as well as an enlightening visit to the Carnegie Science Center. The children have had fun with science in the outdoors, trying their hand at experimentation with testing and charting river water and having the opportunity to work with water distillation as well as with the process of water electrolysis and making Colloidal Silver water! More outdoor activities have seen the children at Justus Park for Easter Egg hunts and Scavenger hunts, encouraging team building and working together. We have also seen the children's grades rise by a letter or even two in subjects like reading and math as we work closely with the children on homework and tutoring, offering our time and positive reinforcement!

Looking ahead, we envision more fun and learning, and some more structured activities. Plans are in motion for the establishment of a live webcam travel center and computer station, opening up new avenues for exploration and learning. We are planning a themed chalk art event, filling and burying a time capsule and currently the children are all working together on a book that we will be publishing with the Student Treasures Fun Company, to be completed in December or January. Additionally, we have high hopes for a Lego club on the horizon, set to become a cherished addition to the program's offerings with the continued generous Lego donations we have received from various members of the community. With these initiatives, Stay and Play aims to continue providing enriching experiences for the youth it serves, nurturing a love for learning and a sense of belonging.


