

Words from Pastor Sandra Jones

"...for surely I know the plans I have for you, says the LORD, plans for your welfare and not for harm, to give you a future with hope." Jeremiah 29:11

Dear Siblings in Christ,

As we have now celebrated the 125th Anniversary of the congregation at Zion and look forward to the closing events of Good Hope's 150th Anniversary celebration scheduled for July, my thoughts, concerns, and questions look toward the future. So much has changed in these past 6 years, I cannot help but wonder what ministry and mission with our Shared Ministry and with our greater Oil City community will look like in the next 5 or 10 years. And what about another 150? That one boggles the mind, doesn't it?

I wonder, but I do not worry. The LORD has plans for good, not harm. Because of Christ, and the work of the Holy Spirit, there is hope for the future.

While I am truly confident in God's presence and that Christ's Church will continue, I am not naïve or sentimental about all of this. I know that the culture around us is changing faster than the church can address it. I know that demographics, finances, availability of clergy and lay leaders, and a host of other factors can challenge any local congregation beyond its resources and its capacity to survive.

So, how do we remain faithful and effective as witnesses to God's grace in Christ Jesus? First, we pray, intentionally, for those we know who are struggling with matters of faith and for one another as we seek to build relationships of trust so that spirituality is something that we can talk about without fear. And then, as we heard in yesterday's (June 19) Gospel reading, Jesus said to the Gerasene demoniac, "Return to your home, and declare how much God has done for you." We are called and instructed to continue to speak with, care for, and reach those closest to us – to our family members, neighbors, co-workers, and folks we know as we tell them, in word and deed, who God is for us, what God has done for us, and how God can reveal purpose and meaning in their lives.

We start where we are with those near to us, opening doors of acceptance, communication, and care. And yes, in these technological times, those near to us may be online thousands of miles away. Neighbors are near and far away, and we are called to love them in Jesus' name.

What if they don't want to talk or listen or claim they don't believe in any of this "God stuff"? Then show them God's grace, the forgiveness of Jesus, and the gentleness of the Holy Spirit in your attitude, the expression in your eyes or on your face, and patience in your relationship. How you live your life as a disciple of Jesus is a witness. Don't give up on them. God hasn't.

What do we do as congregations to reach others with the Good News of God in Christ Jesus? Continue to welcome the stranger and honestly evaluate what we do when someone new to us enters our doors for worship or any other event. Change what needs to be changed to truly accept and incorporate them into a community of faith.

We must continue to reach out in places where God is already at work. Christ's Church can be found in many places, not only in traditional church facilities on a Sunday morning. And as pastoral leadership availability changes, we cannot leave these tasks to pastors only. As a baptized child of God, you are a minister of the Gospel, too!

The message of a future with hope in God's presence has not changed, but how we share it and the audiences we must reach, has. Together, let us be smart, savvy, creative, and risk-taking in year 126 or 151 and beyond, as we serve all in the manner of Jesus.




Thank You





Acceptance 365

The Acceptance 365 Initiative was launched to help minimize all forms of stigma, exclusion, and social bias by instilling hope, providing knowledge, and promoting self-advocacy in our community. The initiative works to provide resources to not only the community, but specifically local businesses and area employers.

Acceptance 365 also strives to promote mental wellness, positive messages, and creation of an accepting environment for all. Good Hope, Zion, and the Community Ministry Committee are proud members and the staff are currently undergoing monthly training in diversity, inclusion, allyship, and minimizing stigma.

Training has been provided by Dr. Kari Finley, Research Scholar/Center Manager at Montana State University. Over the next six months, the sessions will address stigma – what it is, where it comes from, and how to make a difference.

All the volunteers, all who donate supplies and all who hold us up in prayer! Our outreach program would not be possible without all of you.

Our Free Community Meals continue July 12th and July 26th. On July 12th the meal is a piece of Chicken/gravy over stuffing, veggie, fruit, and cookies. On July 26th the meal is a BBQ Pork rib sandwich, chips, veggie, fruit, and cookies. We will distribute laundry pods on July 12th and body wash for July 26th. If you are at the store and think of it, our supply of liquid body wash as well as deodorant is running low. Men's, women's, and unisex would work.

Coffee break continues to thrive. We serve anywhere from 12 to 22 people regularly. Ages range from 18 months to Senior citizens - come join us for fellowship! Coffee Break meets Thursdays from 9:30am to 10:30am at Zion in the Fellowship Hall.

Loads of Love is picking up. The month of July has been spoken for. If you would be willing to distribute quarters to local laundromats in August or September, please let me know. We will be glad to meet with you and/or get you the supplies.

Bags of Love are distributed on the last Thursday of each month. We regularly distribute 12 to 15 bags each month. There are times when we are asked assistance before the distribution day, and we try to keep at least one Bag of Love available in case the need arises. These bags contain enough non-perishable food for 2-3 days.


