

Words from Pastor Mike Parsh

Sisters and Brothers in Christ,

What comes to your mind when you think of Lent? It might be repentance or giving things up or a focus on the cross. For some it brings to mind a heavy-handed season of inward focus that feels dark. For others it has been experienced as a time for excessive guilt. It is not uncommon for Lent to be a six-week meditation on the crucifixion, as if Holy Week and especially Good Friday weren't enough for the church's deep contemplation on Jesus' death. Not everyone loves Lent because of how it has been observed in some times and places. Our practice should change such negative attitudes so that Lent can be a high point of the church year for the faithful.

In spite of all the baggage some people still bring to the season, Lent can become a time of celebration. That may sound strange and unexpected. The key is that the celebration is restrained, is expressed in subdued and anticipatory ways, and is geared toward preparing to celebrate with exuberant joy the paschal mystery at Easter. Lent is a season of fasting, and fasting is about a discipline of restraint so that one can celebrate more deeply and extravagantly something wonderful later. But even in that time of preparation, the joy that is to come is known now. This is Lent.

Lent is also a season of learning the important stories of the faith. In the early days of Christian history, people preparing for baptism at the Easter Vigil attended worship for the readings, sermon, and prayers during Lent. Their goal during Lent was to learn what kind of God they were being baptized into. Many of the readings this year during Lent show who God is or what the life of faith has at its heart: God defies the power of sin and death (Lent 1, Lent 5), provides the water of life (Lent 3), and makes us children of light (Lent 4). In the early church, the catechumen was invited to reflect on the questions "What sort of God is this, whose community I am joining?" and "What challenges will I face in my life in the church, the body of Christ, after baptism?" The defeated power of sin and death, the water of life in baptism, and the light of Christ all are revisited in the Three Days.

While the culture and some loud church voices in the United States cast faith as an individual's personal and private idea, the texts of Lent draw us in a different direction, into the community baptized into Christ and Christ's promises. Therefore, the journey of Lent could be thought of through the lens of the baptismal liturgy: we turn away from sin, death, and the devil; we turn toward Christ and Christ's promises, which are full of grace and love and are trustworthy.

Lent is a season of preparation that often has taken on a quiet, meditative quality, serving as a balance to the loud, bright, lively festival seasons of the church year. Ash Wednesday invites the whole Christian community into the disciplines of Lent: self-examination and repentance, prayer and fasting, sacrificial giving, and works of love.

During this Lenten season, we are called to contemplate this powerful love and grace which Jesus offers to us. As we recount the weakest moments of our lives and bring them to God in confession, we are renewed and reunited with the Creator. We are free to delight in the gifts of God and learn to live our lives in the fullness of God's presence among us.



Congratulations to Scott Kurschinske who married Elizabeth Deemer on February 4. Scott is the son of Jan Ruditis.




We will be holding our Annual workshops for the PA - 1000 Property Tax or Rent Rebate Program to assist folks in completing and filing their applications. The Property Tax/Rent Rebate program benefits eligible Pennsylvanians age 65 and older; widows and widowers age 50 and older; and people with disabilities age 18 and older. The income limit is \$35,000 a year for homeowners and \$15,000 annually for renters, and half of Social Security income is excluded.

Beginning on March 17 we will be at the Oil City YWCA from 9-11 am

and then on March 23 we will be at the Franklin VFW from 9-11 am. There is no charge for this service.

Many thanks to all who donated to the Souper Bowl of Caring! We collected six large boxes of nonperishable food items and donated them to the Community Services of Venango County.




GAME DAY -MARCH 19TH


