Words From Pastor Mike Parsh

Greetings in the name of the Risen Christ,

Over the years I have learned that children have a lot more insight than we think. For example, here is conversation that author Margaret Donaldson shared in one of her books¹:

Callum (age 4): Is God everywhere? Mother: Yes, dear. Callum: Is he in this room? Mother: Yes, he is. Callum: Is he in my mug? Mother (growing uneasy): Er-yes. Callum (clapping his hand over his mug): Got him!

The trait that means "God is everywhere" is called omnipresence. It is one of those mysteries that, on the one hand, makes God worthy of being God and, on the other hand, can drive us mortals crazy.

From our human point of view, it is simply impossible for any one being to be everywhere at once. Our first inclination may be to reject the idea outright. After all, if we can't experience it or even imagine it, how can it be? Then we remember that just a century ago no one would have believed tales of the internet, the microwave oven, or supersonic flight. I have my doubts that we will ever fully understand all of the mysteries of God. It would take thousands of lifetimes to possibly come close to unlocking all the mysteries of God. Even then we would probably still have a lot to learn.

If we try to explain the mysteries of God in a scientific way, we may find some answers but then again, we may not. I once read an article about a study that discovered the following.

There seems to be a level of matter in the ultrasub-atomic realm where particles that moved in a lab in California seem to affect particles everywhere else on the planet. At some level we can't see or control, everything seems to be connected to everything else. At the risk of reasoning just a bit too much into something I really don't fully understand, God may just be



present in the layer of stuff at the core of all of reality. In plain terms, science may be extremely close to "discovering" the omnipresence of God in the basic stuff of the whole earth.

If this discovery becomes big news, religious people everywhere need to stand up and shout "I told you so!" But the truth is, we won't believe it because we see it in some scientific journal - we believe it because we believe in God. That belief calls us to accept a whole group of things as truth, even though we cannot prove them or even fully understand them. Generations have called this part of the mystery of faith.

God is larger than anything we can comprehend in worldly terms. We cannot capture God by holding our hand over the cup, yet we can trust that God is everywhere, a wonderful unseen presence guiding our lives and showering us with love, peace and strength in those rough patches of our lives.

So, as we enter into the season of Pentecost at the end of the month, maybe we need to take some time to look at how the spirit of God is at work in our lives - even if we can only see the Spirit at work when we reflect back. The Spirit sometimes moves in unseen ways.

the community. One of the items that everyone agreed on was paper products such as toilet paper, paper towels and tissues. The committee has started collecting toilet paper to start and distributed it on the first meal day in April. It went well and we will continue to have it available once a month.
